Transforming Classroom Directions with Check & Circle

Bringing Check & Circle into your existing classroom routines, assignments, and directions can help you transform simple tasks into tasks that encourage deeper reflection.

Examples:

Finish by completing the task	Finish by reflecting using specific criteria
"Complete problems 1 through 10."	"Complete problems 1 through 10 and then circle the problem that was most interesting to you. Explain why the problem interested you in the margin next to it. Then put a check next to a problem that you'd like to do again some time."
"Draw your favorite part of the story."	"Draw your favorite part of the story and circle an object that makes this part memorable for you. Write a few sentences explaining why the object is important to a character in the story or why the object is important to you."
"Complete this reading."	"As you complete this reading, check at least 2 familiar words or phrases and circle 1 new word or phrase."
